Senior Class Prophecy

Date: Wednesday evening, May 18, 1967

Place: Capital Theatre, Hollywood

Time: 7:00 p.m., P.S.T.

While on a trip along the west coast, I secured tickets to the program, "This Is Your Life." The M.C. stepped out on the stage and there was something in his wide smile and wavy hair that seemed familiar. When he started to speak the impression of familiarity was even more pronounced, and I was so busy trying to remember where I had seen him before that I missed what he was saying.
