Carol Sue Govoro has become famous as a hair stylist. She has made popular the African hairdo--worn with a bone on top.

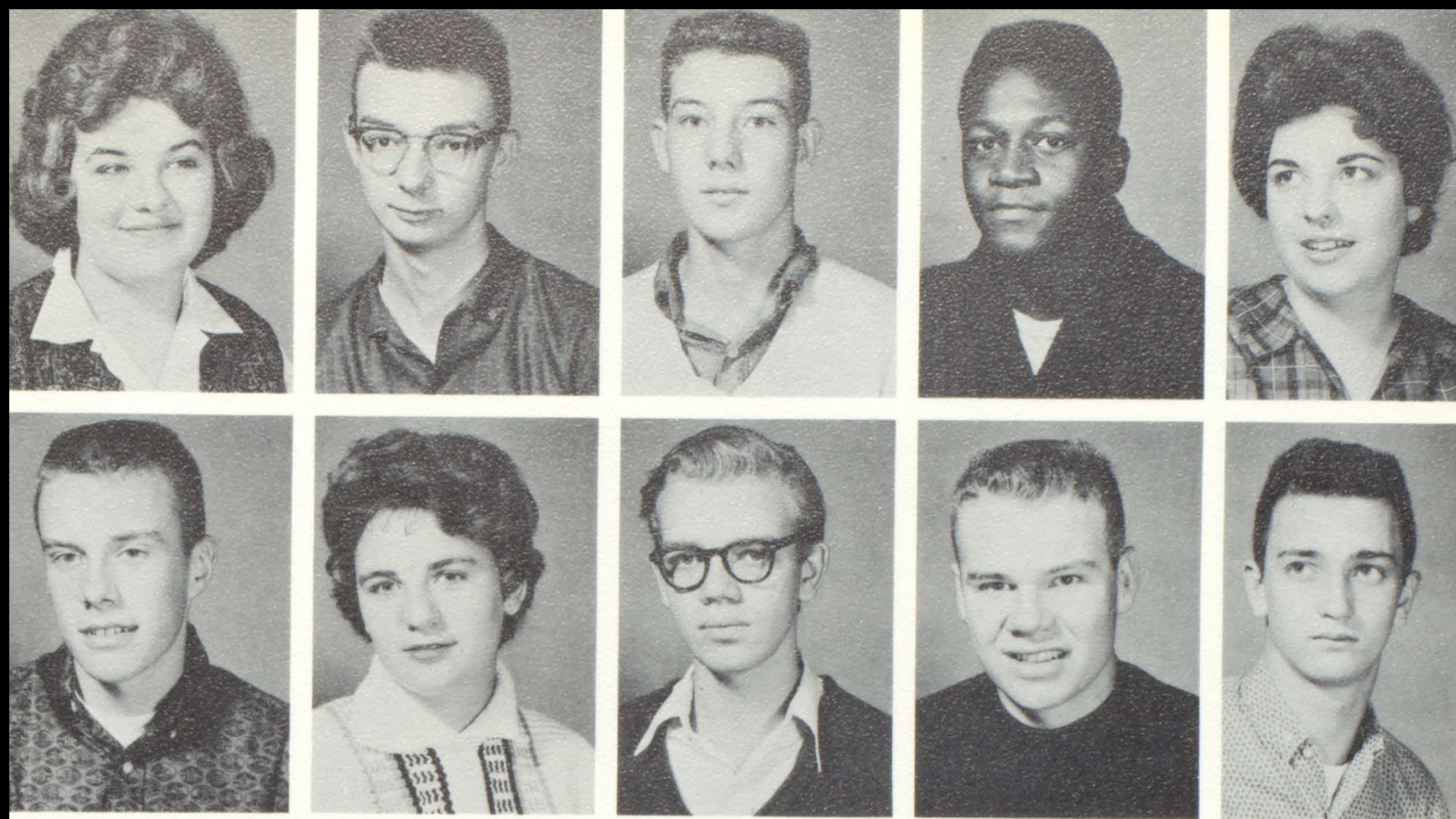
