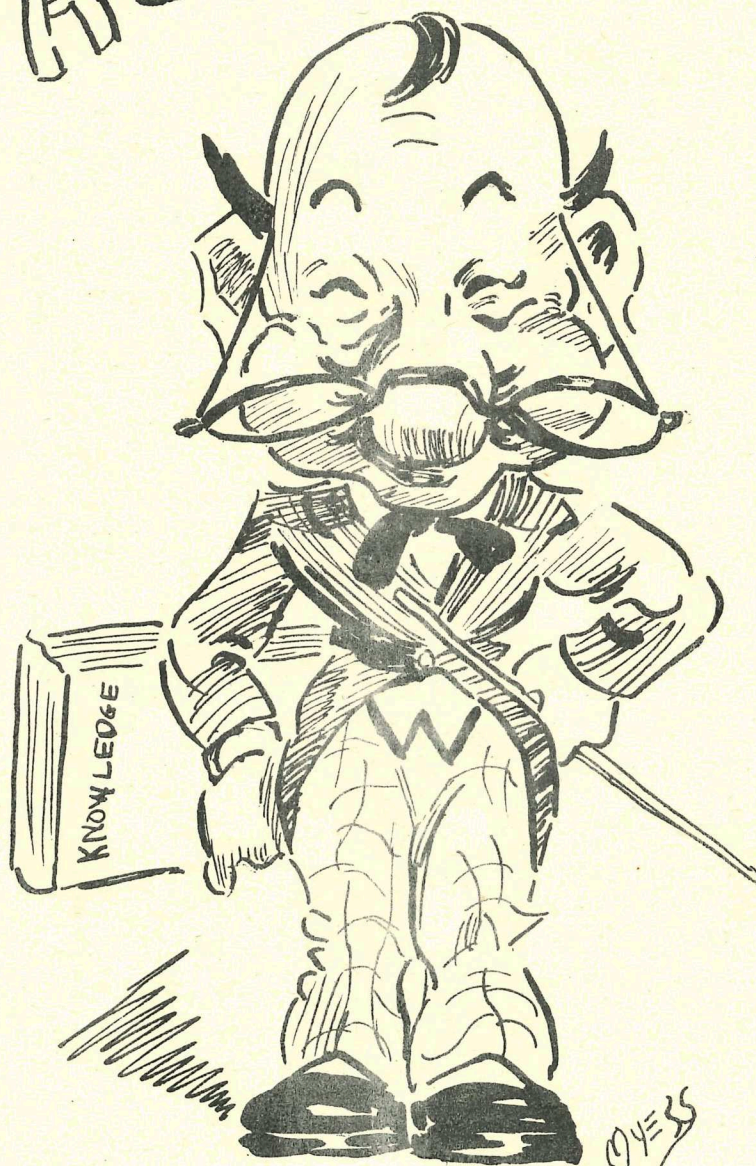

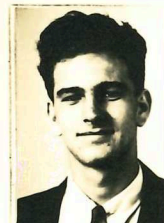

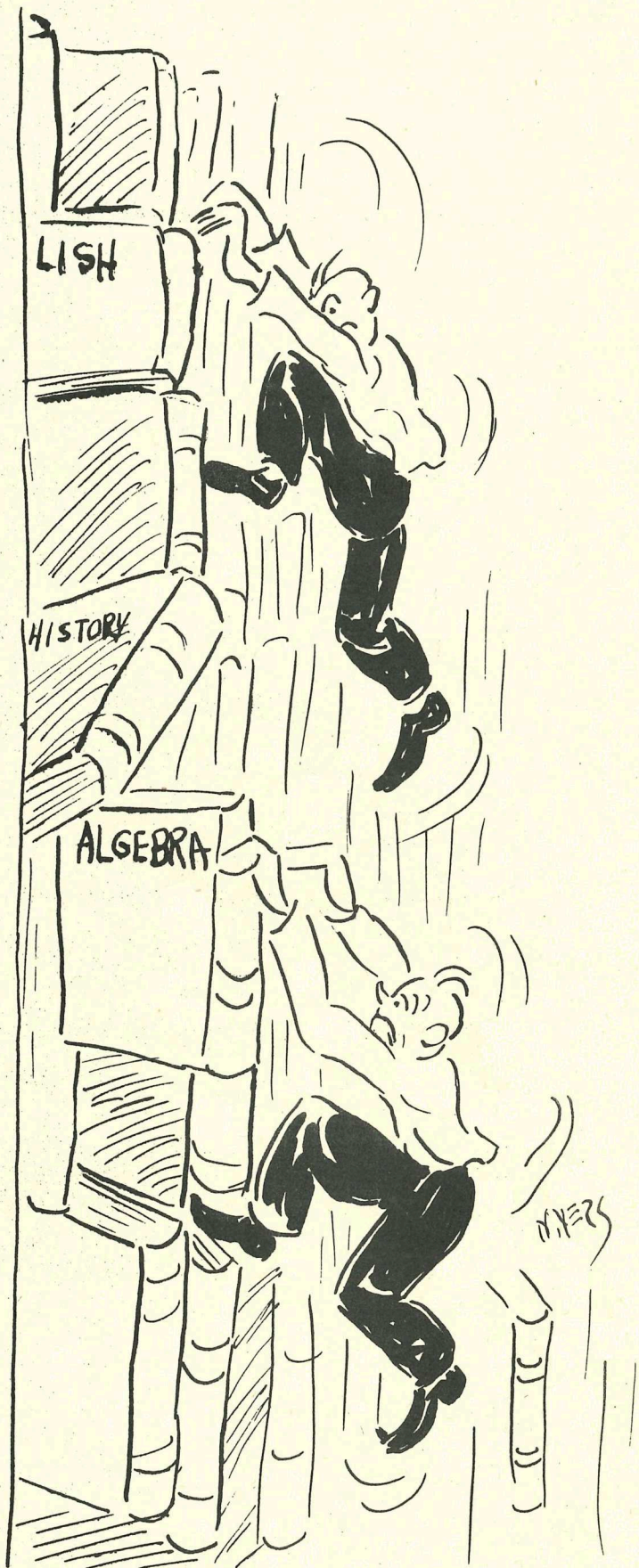

SEPTEMBER, 1940 FOUND FORTY-SIX BRAVE FRESHMEN ENTERING THE DOORS OF WRIGHT CITY HIGH SCHOOL. THEY WERE A LITTLE FRIGHTENED OF THE WORK AHEAD BUT STARTED OUT WITH A WILL, FOR THEY WERE DESTINED TO BE THE GRADUATING CLASS OF 1945.

SINCE THAT SEPTEMBER IN 1940, THE JUNIOR CLASS HAS LOST SIX MEMBERS BUT NONE OF ITS PEP AND AMBITION.

CLASS OFFICERS ELECTED TO GUIDE THE JUNIOR CLASS THROUGH A SUCCESSFUL YEAR IN 1943-44 WERE:

THE SOPHOMORE CLASS

SEPTEMBER 8, 1942 IS A DAY NEVER TO BE FORGOTTEN BY THIRTY-TWO MEMBERS OF THIS CLASS. IT WAS A MEMORABLE DAY BECAUSE IT WAS THEIR FIRST DAY AT HIGH SCHOOL. THEY WERE A FUNNY-LOOKING BUNCH. SOME OF THEM WERE THIN, SOME WERE FAT, SOME WERE TALL, SOME WERE SHORT, BUT ALL WERE GREEN. THE GREENNESS GRADUALLY WORE AWAY AND THEY BECAME FULL-FLEDGED MEMBERS OF OUR HIGH SCHOOL AND WHEN INITIATED ON WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 7.

ON SEPTEMBER 7, 1943 TWENTY-SIX SOPHOMORES RETURNED TO W.C.H.S. THERE ARE FEWER STUDENTS IN THE CLASS THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL TERM.

ON FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 1943, THE SOPHOMORES INITIATED THE FRESHMEN. THESE NEW GIRLS WERE REQUIRED TO DRESS LIKE BOYS AND THE BOYS TO DRESS LIKE GIRLS. IN THE AFTERNOON AN ALL-SCHOOL PARTY WAS ENJOYED IN THE SCHOOL YARD.

THE SPECIAL EXTRA-CURRICULAR EVENT OF THE YEAR WAS A PARTY GIVEN IN THE SCHOOL BUILDING. DECORATIONS WERE IN RED, WHITE, AND BLUE. THOSE PRESENT WHO ENJOYED DANCING, AND WELL-PLANNED GAMES WERE MEMBERS OF THE FACULTY, THE SOPHOMORE CLASS, AND GUESTS FROM OTHER CLASSES.

WRIGHT CITY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR OF 1943-1944, THE GRADE SCHOOL HAD AN ENROLLMENT OF EIGHTY-SEVEN; THIRTY-FIVE IN THE PRIMARY ROOM, THE THIRTY-ONE IN THE INTERMEDIATE ROOM, AND TWENTY-ONE IN THE UPPER ROOM.

THE SIXTH, SEVENTH, AND THE EIGHTH GRADE STUDENTS SERVED AS PATROLS.

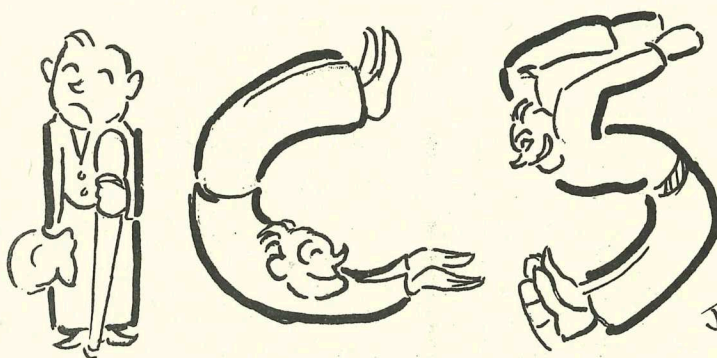
THE INTERMEDIATE ROOM ORGANIZED A NATURE KNIGHTS' CLUB WITH THE FOLLOWING OFFICERS:
