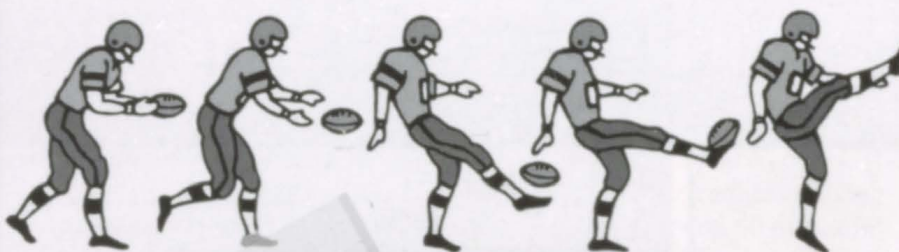

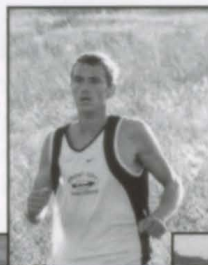

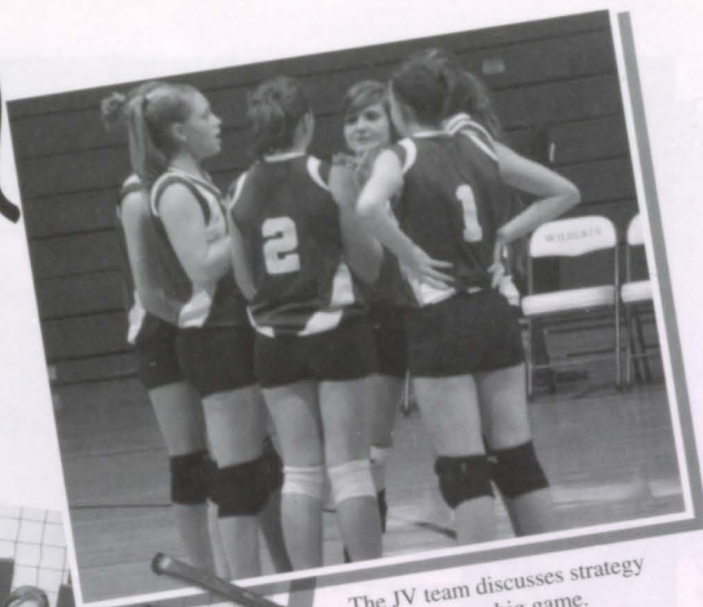


"My most memorable moment in XC was when the bus got stuck in the mud at the Clopton meet and a tractor had to pull it out." Says Eric Smurl.

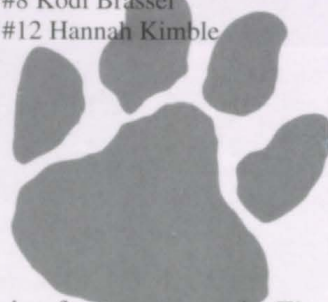

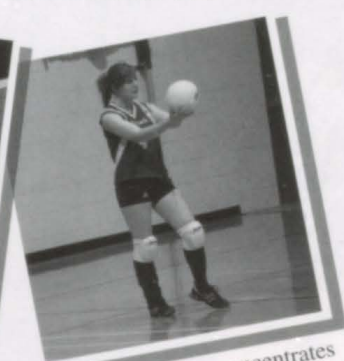

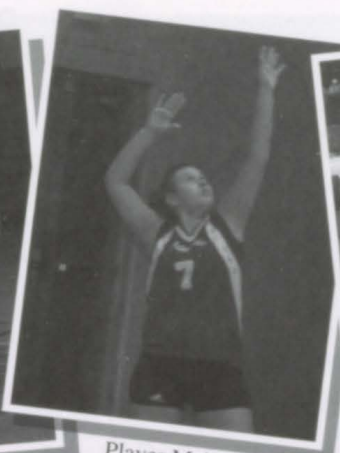

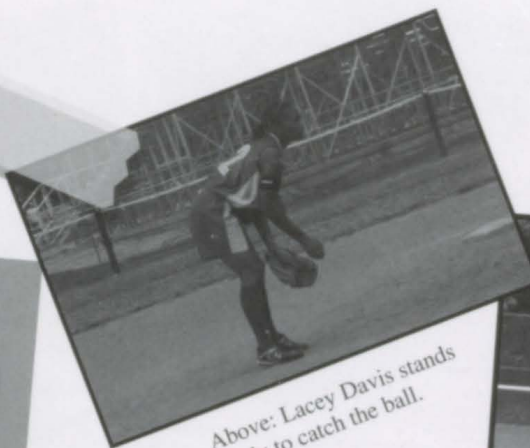

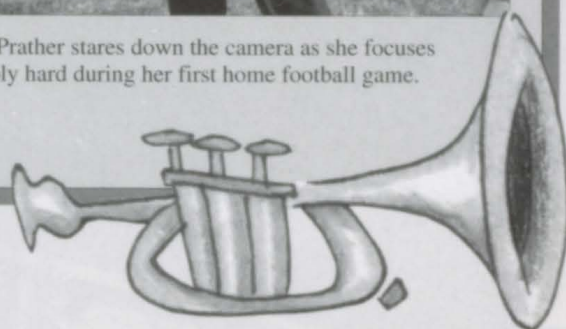

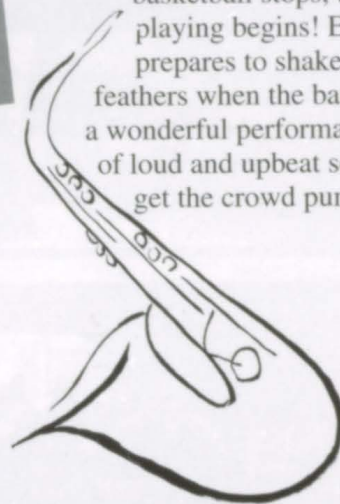

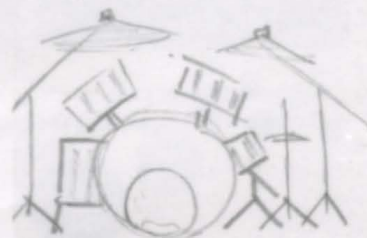

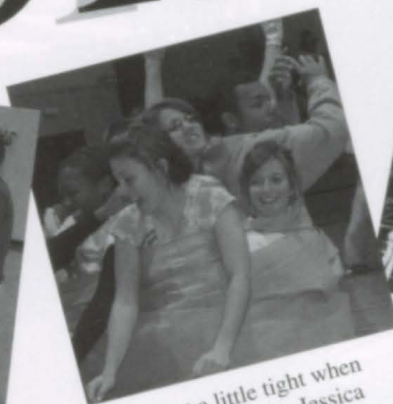

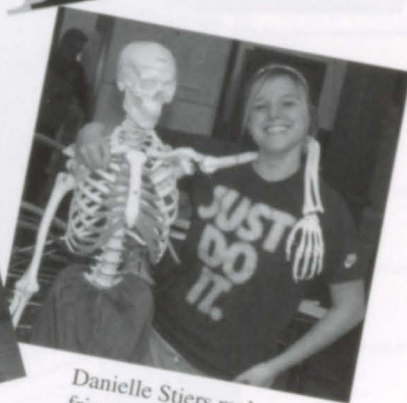

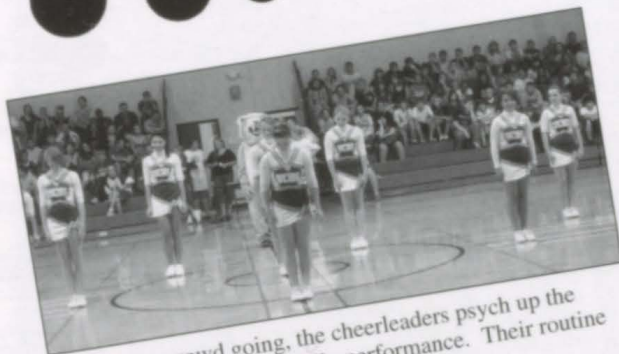

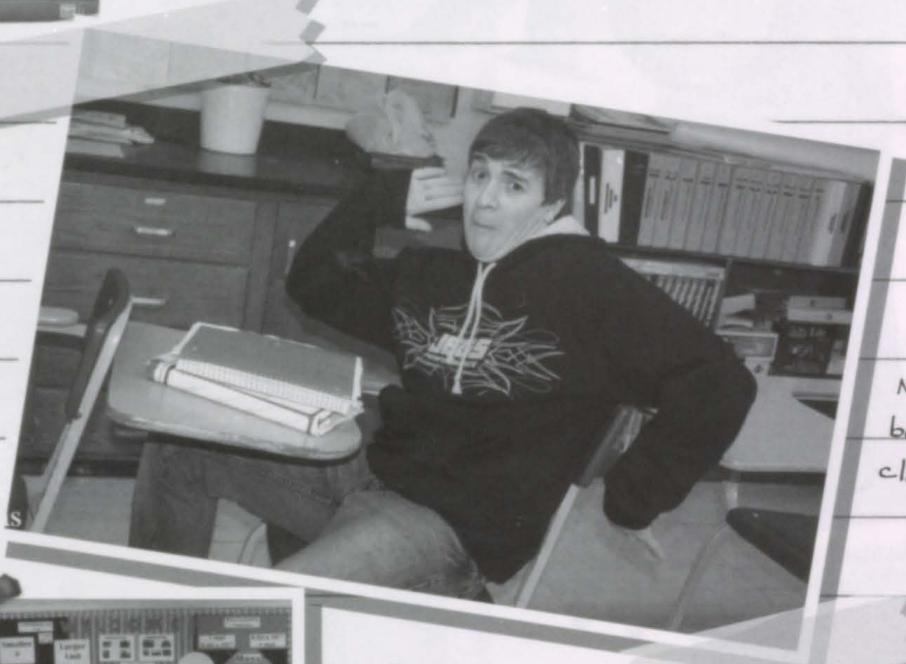

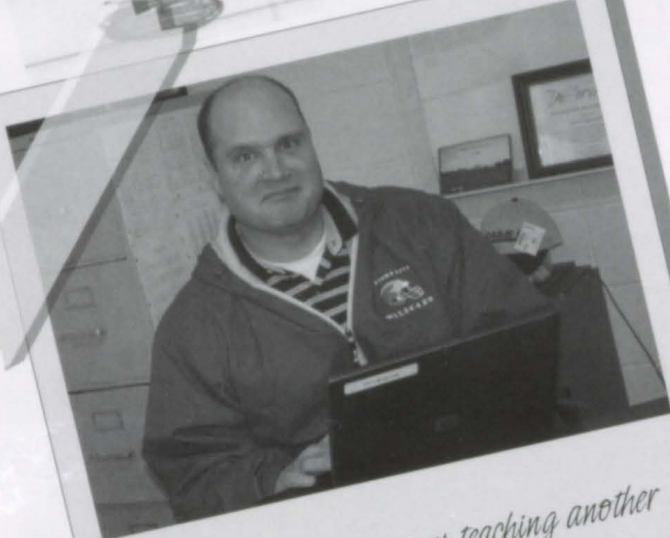

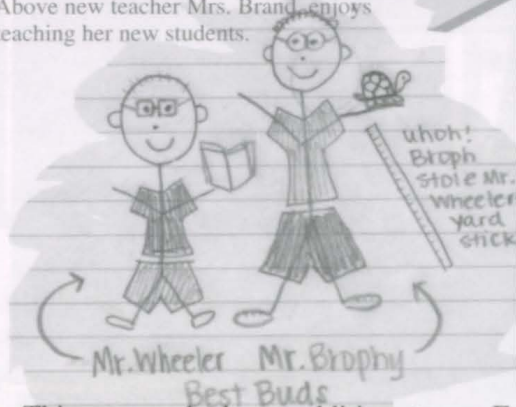

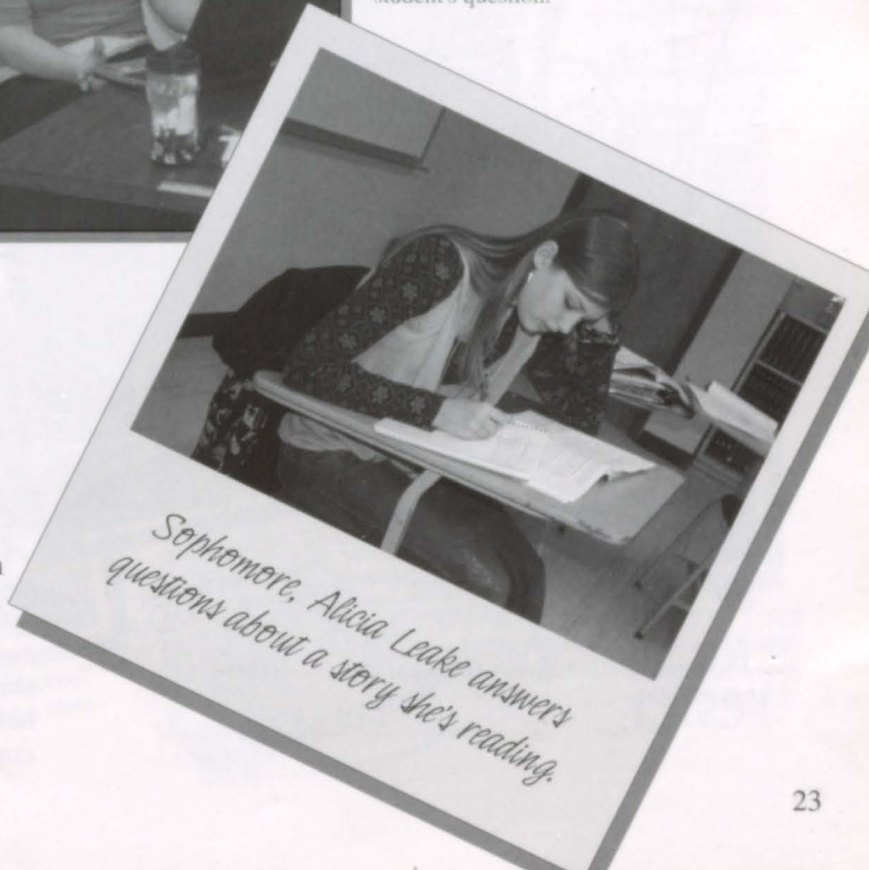

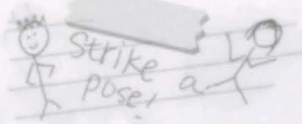

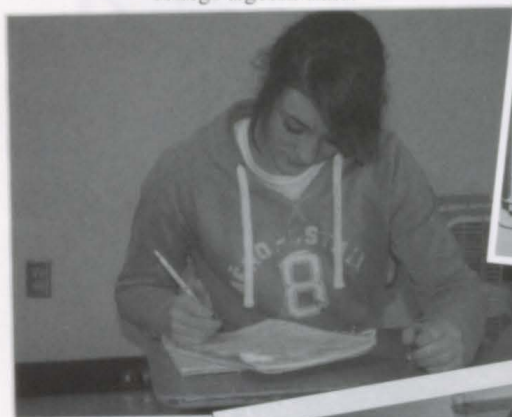

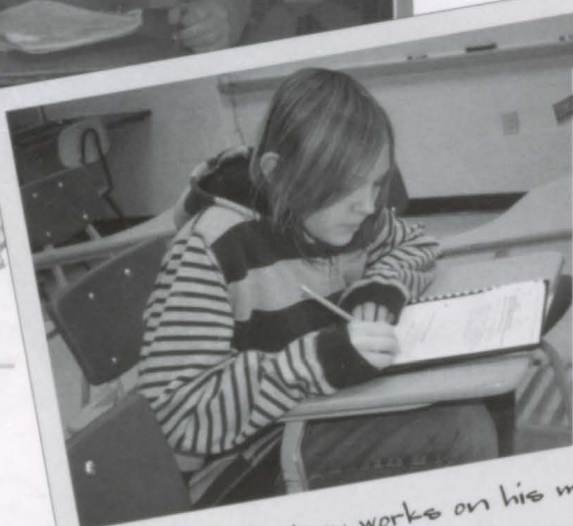

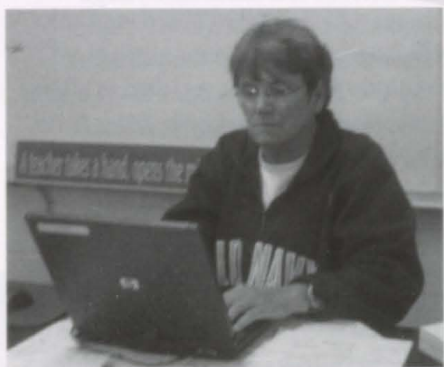
Since man first harnessed fire, science has advanced the way we live. Today we have the ability to alter the world around using high end technology, all of which stems from some branch of science.

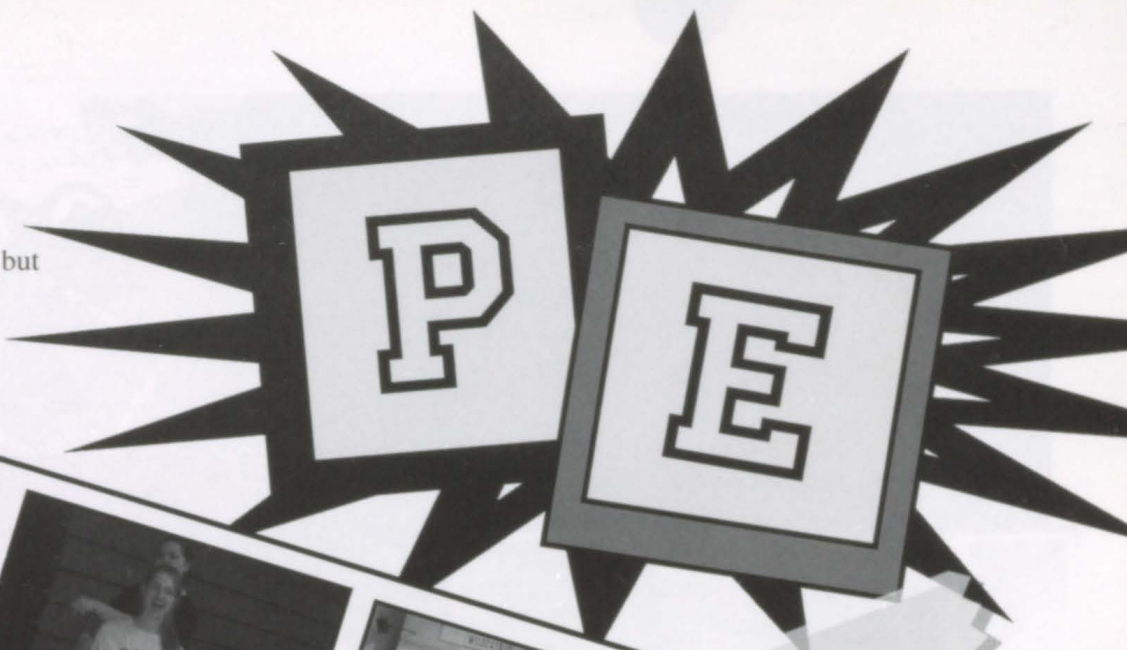

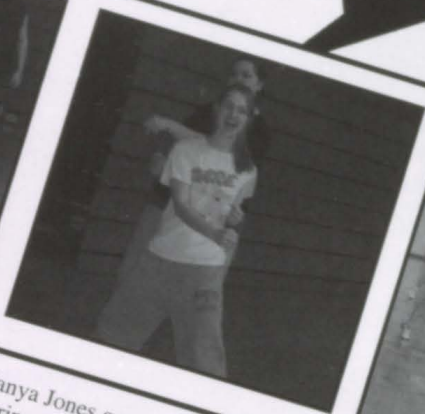

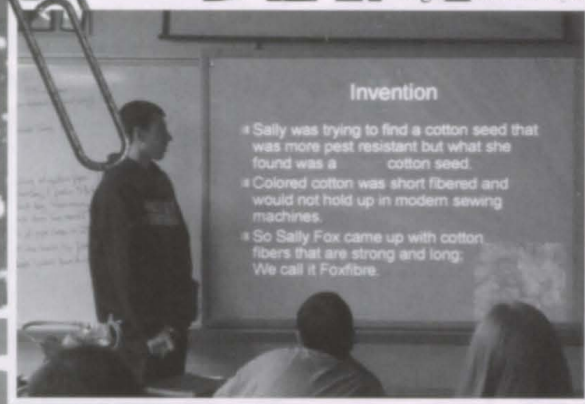

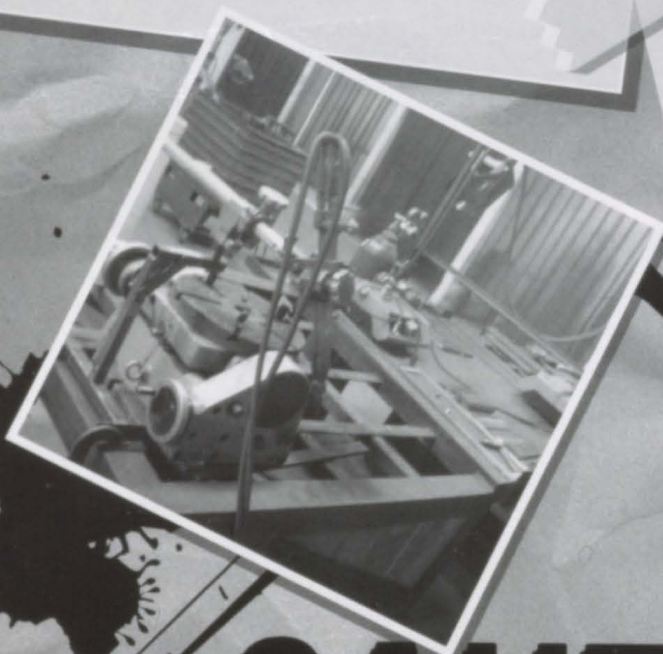

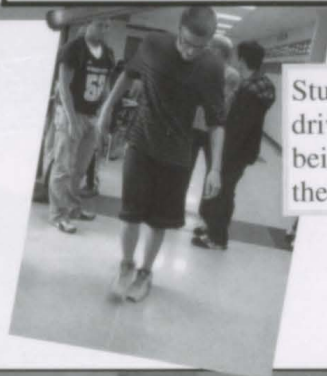

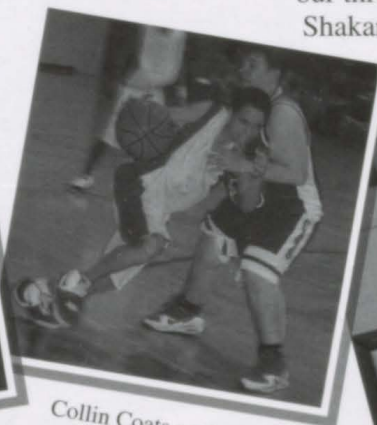

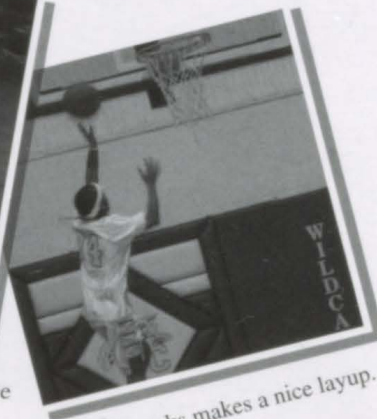

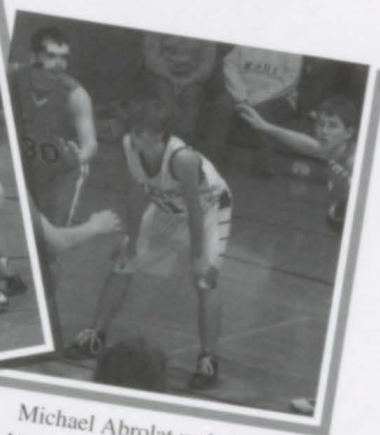

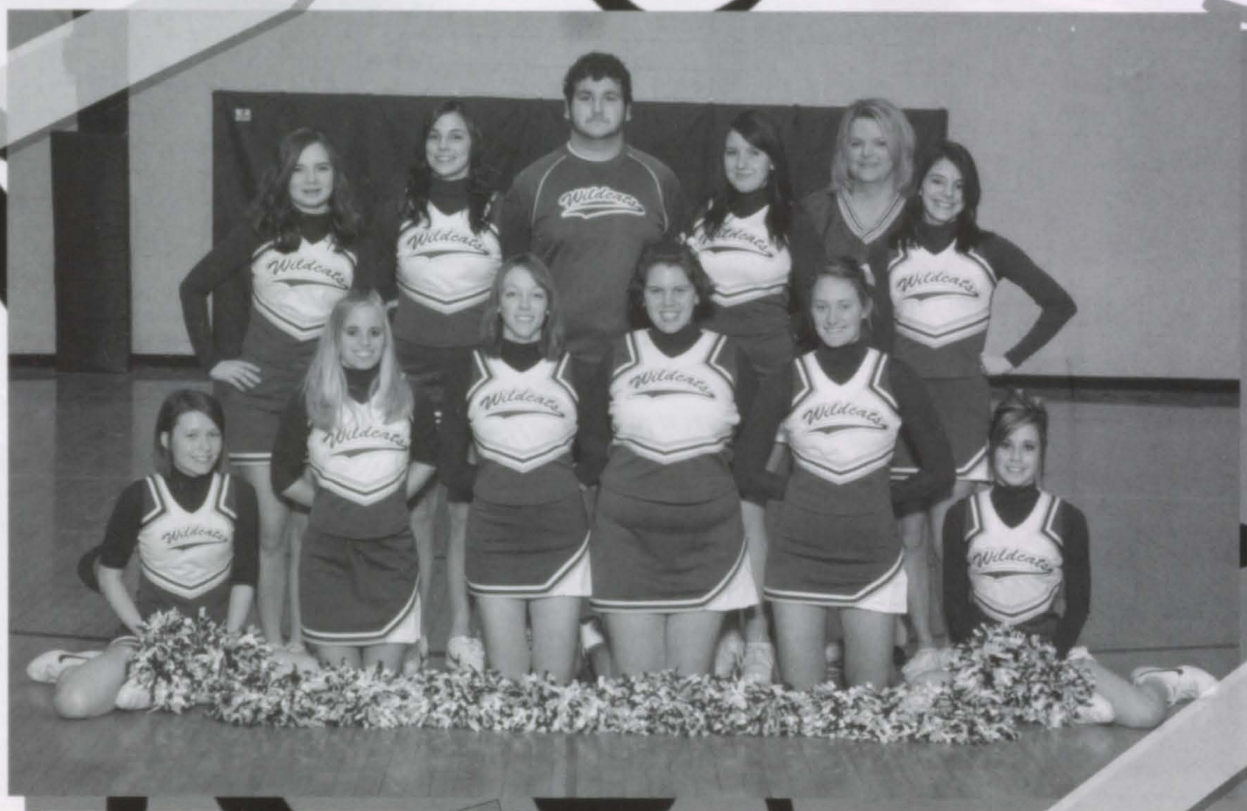

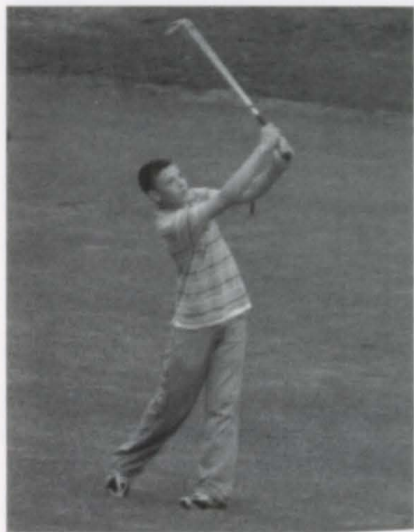

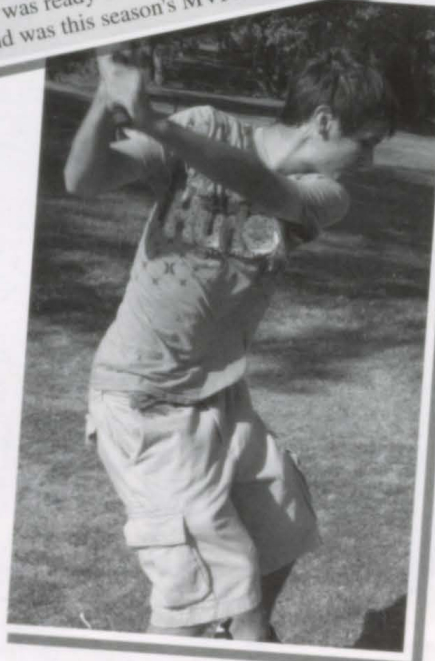
Deryk Rowland, the only freshman to make Varsity, had a very successful season this year.

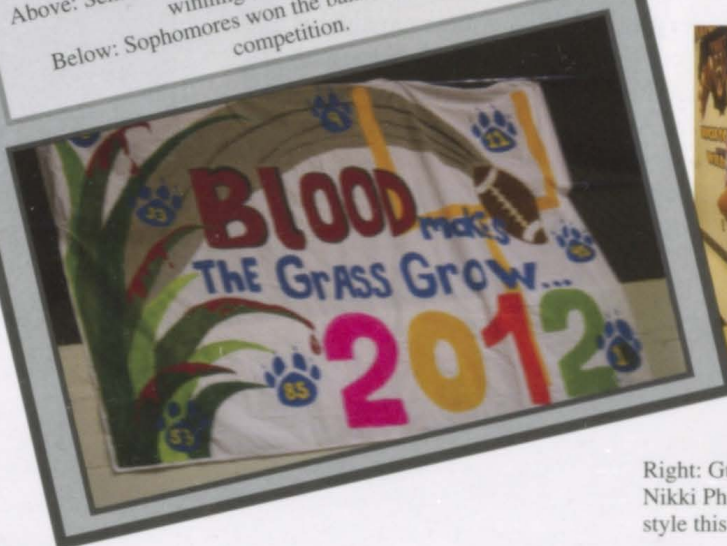

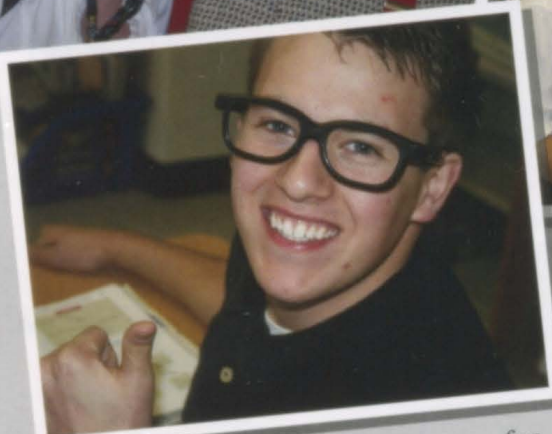

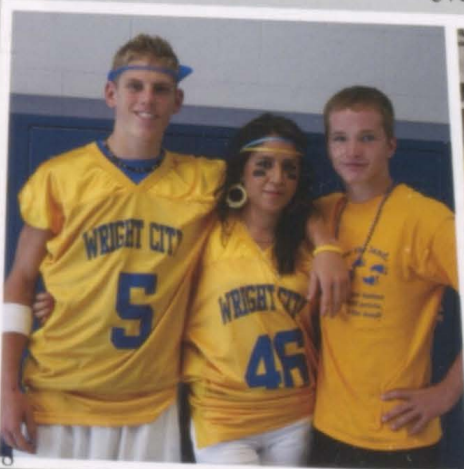

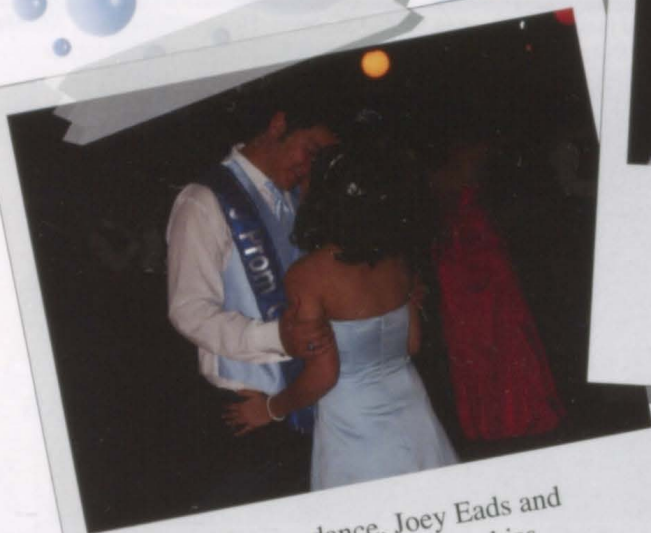

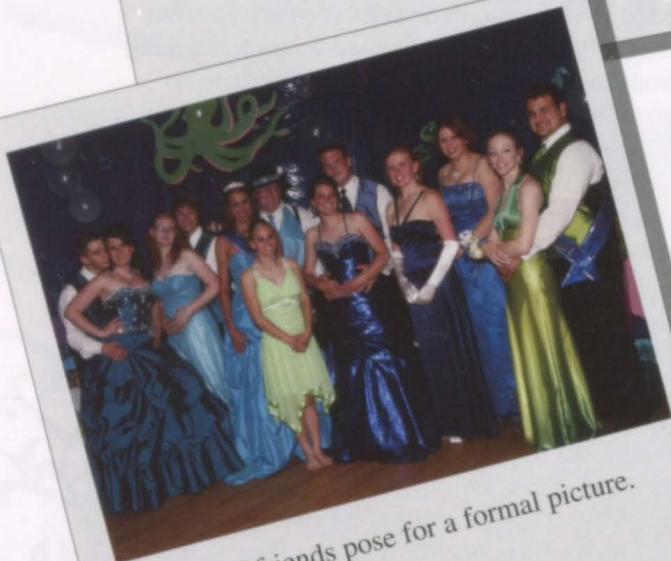


