



It is with the greatest appreciation for her effort and devotion to Wright City High School that we dedicate the 1963 annual to Miss Iris Schaper.









bride of Abs O. Lutely, owner of the airlines.



Wright City Wins High School Planned Progress




Six high schools entered. They were: Augusta, Fort Zumwalt, Francis Howell, Warrenton,


Wentzville, and Wright City.
