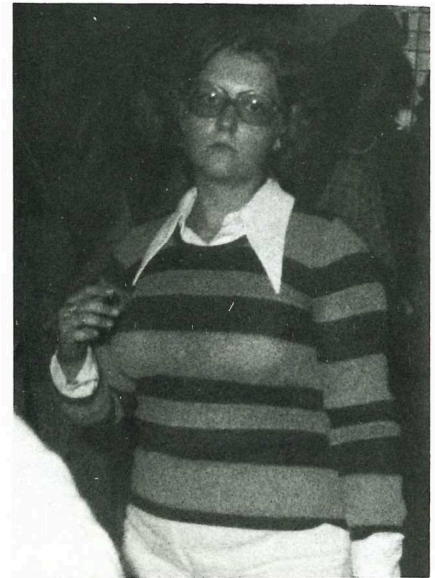


Back-To-School Dance

Barnwarming Successful

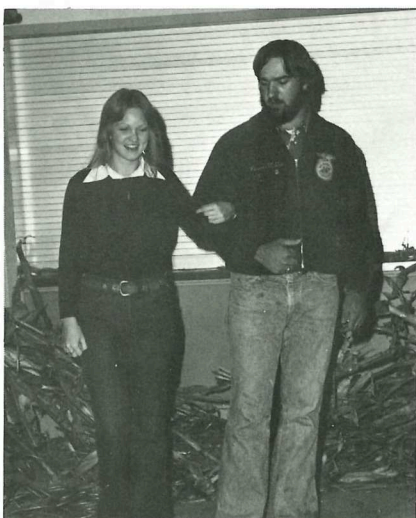

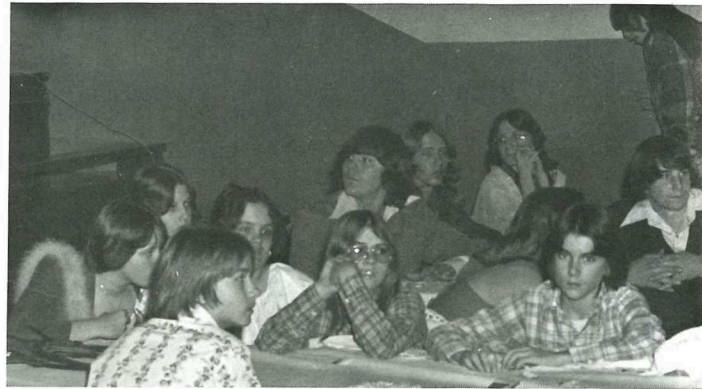
Christmas Dance

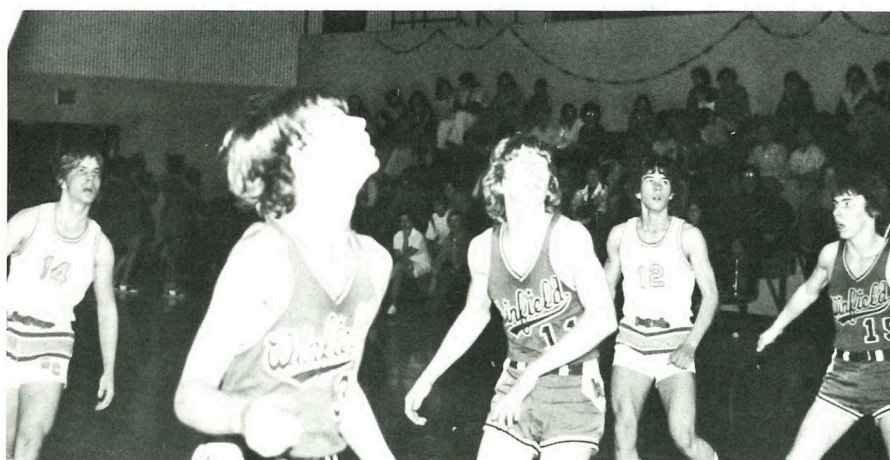
Junior Varsity Basketball

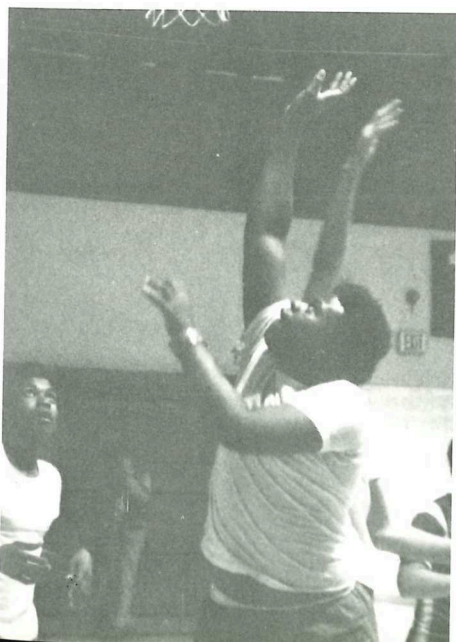
Eighth Grade

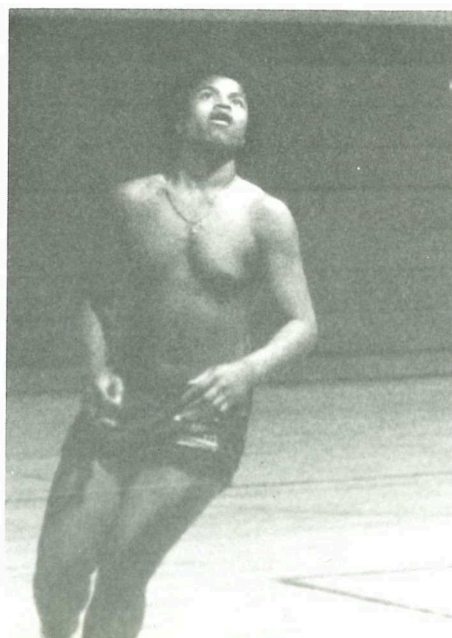

Baseball Has A Swinging Year

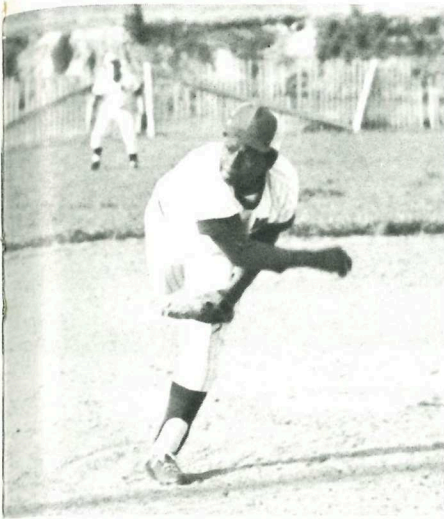

FFA - A Golden Past, A Brighter Future

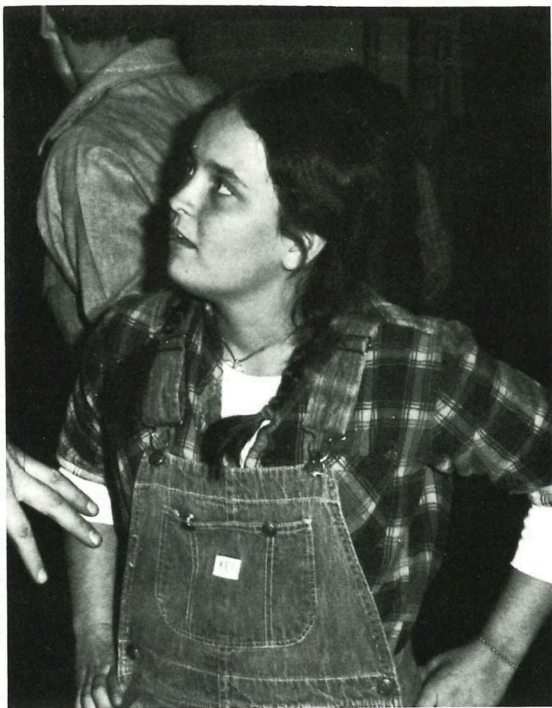

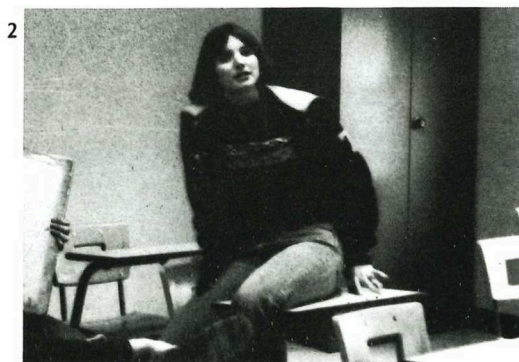
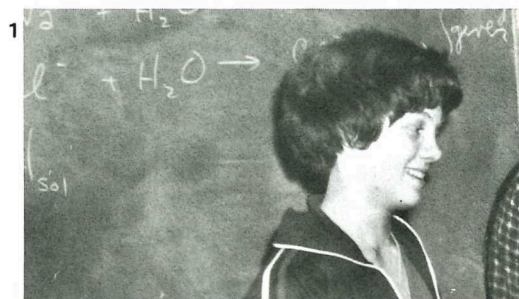
Student Council 1978

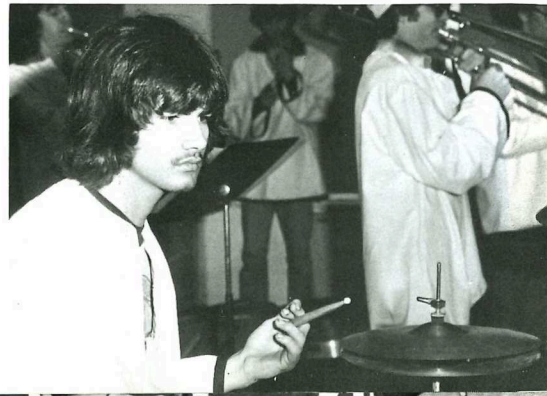
