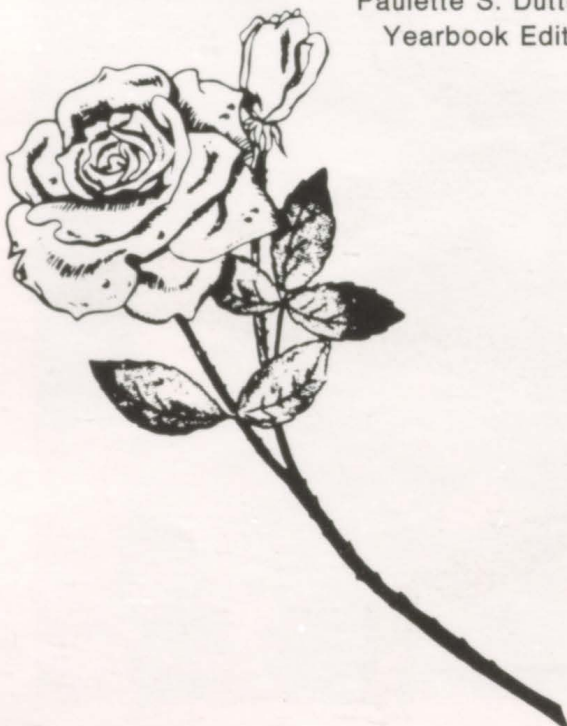
Twenty-five years from now we will talk about, laugh about, and show off our books to our children, wanting our own children to strive to do their best.

The United States reacted immediately to the in-

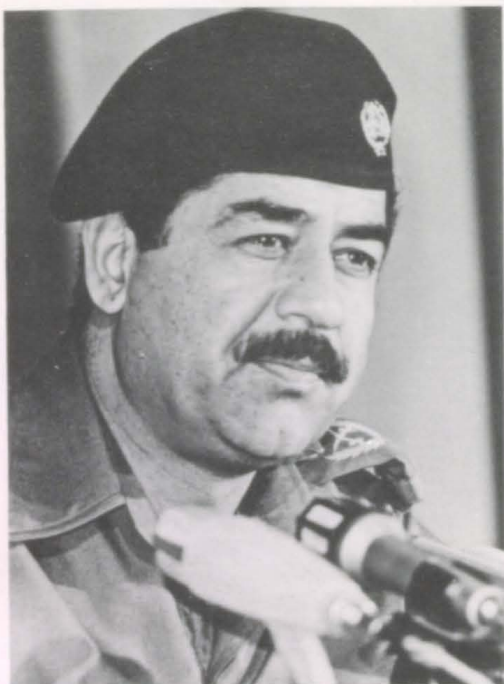

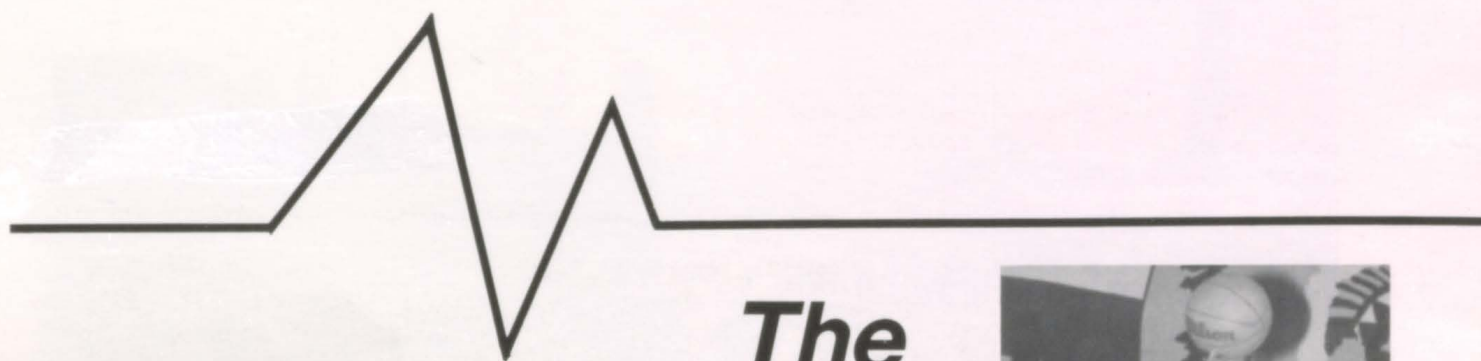


The Heartbeat of Basketball is this year's 1990-91 Varsity Boys Team. Night after night the boys worked very hard every practice and did the best they could do each game.

We hope they can be a "Push It" for a perfect season next year. We congratulate them for an enjoyable and exciting season and wish them luck for the upcoming year.



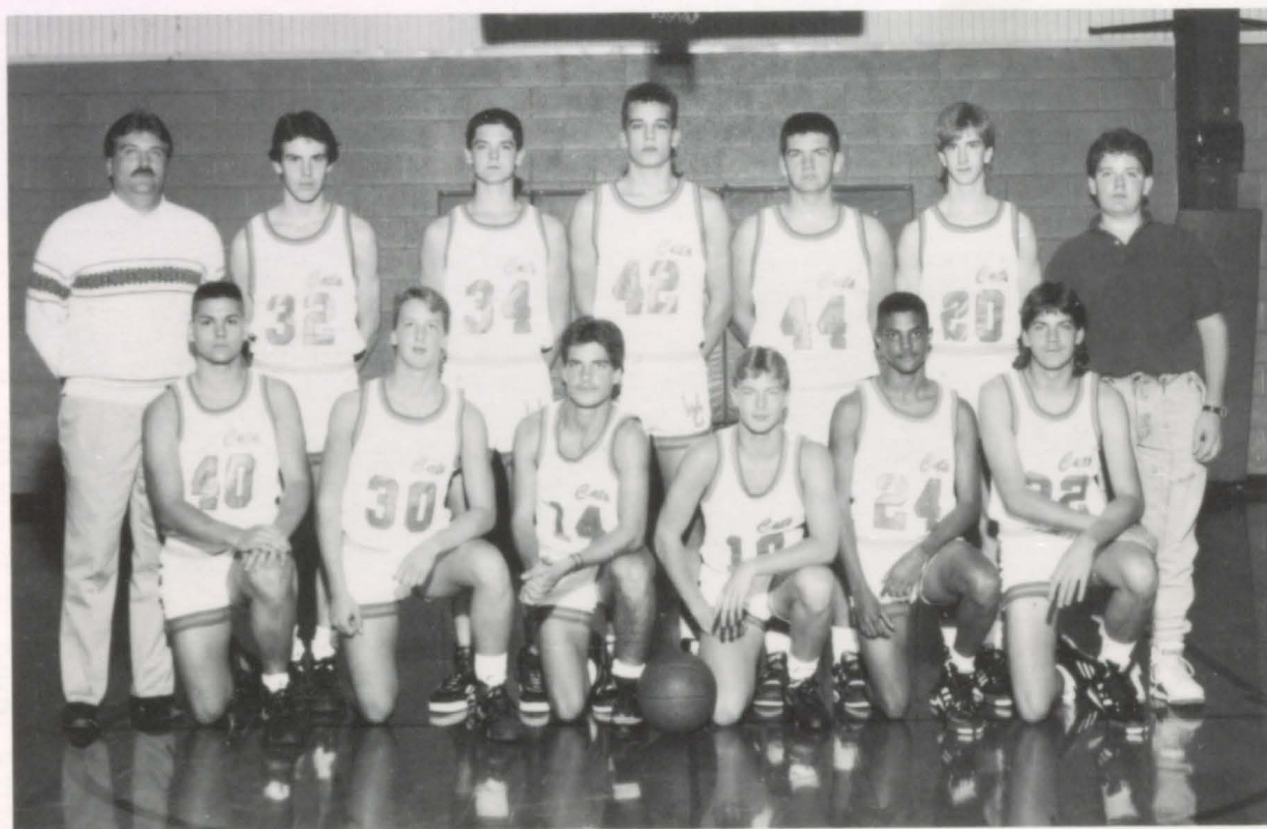

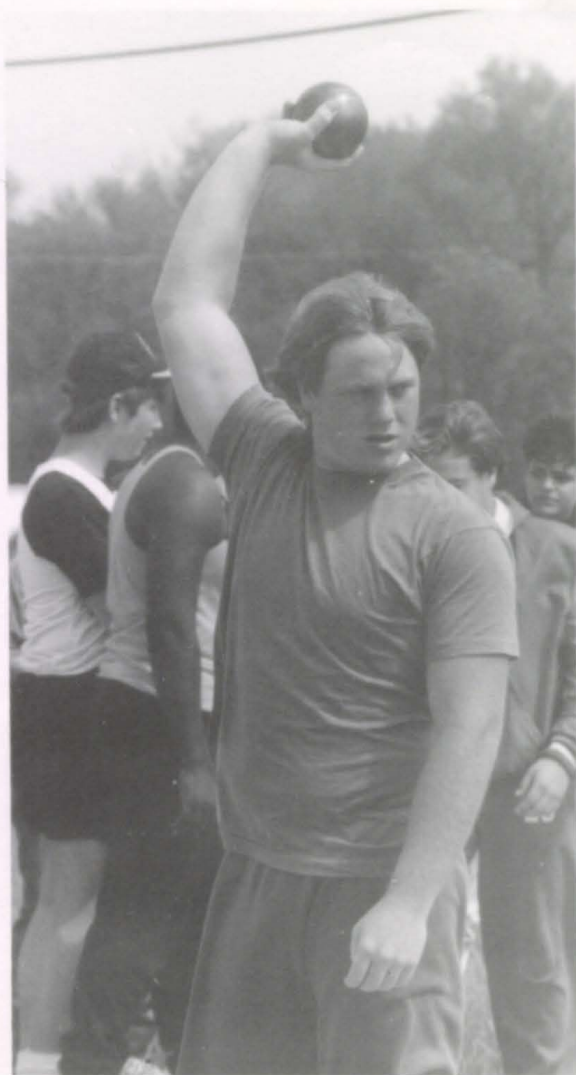

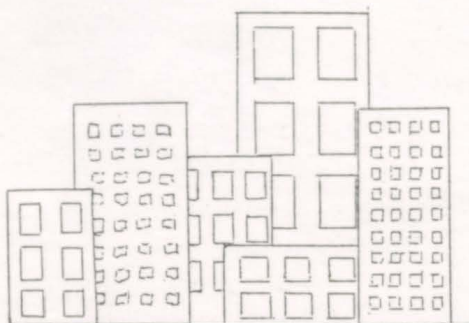
