
FHA and FFA Chapters

Sponsor Annual Blood Drive













The Wright Spirit in 93!





The final score was 48 to 43 in favor of the Lady Cats.



Being young and playing older and more experienced teams, we were at a slight disadvantage. We started out slow, but finished strong.


This team was one of the hardest working I have ever coached. They gave 110% most of the time. This payed off at he end of the season when we beat some big teams.

We will miss the seniors. They contributed a lot to our success this year, and we are looking forward to next year. With many young players getting varsity experience, I feel we will do well."




"This year's Flag Corp was a lot of fun, exclaimed senior, Christina Gerland, "I enjoyed being captain and working with the rest of the squad."

The cheerleaders worked really hard this year and their hard work payed off in their performances.




The Right Foot Forward

On October 15, the FHA took part in a Regional Meeting at Community R-6 High School. They met with teen parents and some discussed their experiences in that area.



Shop Quick - Learning Can Be Fun

Shop Quick was the name of the new Wright City High School Store run by the Resource Center. The store had it's grand opening the second week of school.

The store maintained a well stocked inventory of candy bars, cupcakes, potatoe chips, and items such as sweat shirts, tee shirts, and other logo items to promote school spirit.

Activities and responsibilities for running Shop Quick were designed in order to take advantage of many useful educational opportunities. For example, small business offices were set up in the classroom. Each office dealt with a different vendor. A student was "hired" to serve as office manager for each vendor. It was the responsibility of the office manager to keep track of the inventory purchased from that particular vendor, determine when an item went on sale, and order new merchandise as needed. In addition there was a finance office and a bookkeeping department. The students interviewed for the jobs in each office. When a student worked as a sales person in the store, a time card was used to keep track of the time worked.

The school store has proven to be a valuable life centered learning experience for the students of the Resource Center. The teachers, Dorry Davidson and Vicky Sayers, in the Resource Center used the store as a teaching tool to simulate the operation of a small business, and used student involvement in the store to teach the knowledge and skills needed to run a small business. The store provided the students with real life experiences in mathematics, economics, business administration and a study of human behavior.
